RE: Prayer and the Daily Order of Business

DATE: January 27, 2016

As you know, prayer is the second item on the daily Order of Business for the House of Representatives during session. *See* Rule 7(A)(2). If you wish to lead the prayer, or to invite a member of the clergy to lead the prayer, please direct your request by email to my assistant Jana Babel.

Please note the following principles in submitting your requests.

- 1. Rule 7 reserves the second daily Order of Business expressly and exclusively for prayer. Prayer, as commonly understood and in the long-honored tradition of the Arizona House of Representatives, is a solemn request for guidance and help from God.
- 2. A Member's request to lead the prayer, or to invite a member of the clergy to lead the prayer, is an avowal that the request is for the stated purpose. Members who wish to observe a moment of silence, recite a poem, express personal sentiments or speak rather than pray, should rise to a point of personal privilege to do so. *See* Rule 26(B)(2).
- 3. No particular faith will be excluded or favored in considering requests to lead the prayer or to invite clergy for that purpose.
- 4. The privilege of leading the prayer must not be exploited to proselytize or advance any one, or to disparage any other, faith or belief.
- 5. Prayer should be solemn, respectful in tone, non-coercive, and reflect upon shared ideals and common ends.
- 6. Members must observe the rules of decorum regardless of whether they participate in the prayer.
