Dear Ms. Tomasch:

For over 14 years The Sun Valley Group, Inc. (SVG) has improved the quality of life for hundreds of clients. The work of a fiduciary is multidisciplinary and often draws on knowledge of social work, medicine, finance and legal disciplines—not an easy task.

It may benefit you to know that in over 14 years of experience we have only had the need to apply for Medicaid (AHCCCS) benefits for a total of 4 clients. Serving as a court appointed Guardian and Conservator is a difficult, stressful and labor-intensive responsibility which has great inherent risk. Much of the duties of a fiduciary, such as having on-call 24 hours/7 days a week availability, are uncompensated. Despite the high level of risk, professional fiduciaries provide a critical service to those in need.

We have successfully recovered millions of dollars in cash and assets from exploiters for our clients to ensure they are provided for in the future. We have obtained millions in collections, awards and benefits for which our clients were entitled.
